Man Machine Interface – Be Clear, Stay Clear!

Every year we still see incidents of Employees and Contractors having accidents when coming into contact with Mechanical Handling Equipment (MHE) at loading points. How can we reduce these incidents?

When arriving at Loading Points always pay attention to the Inductions on offer, take 2 minutes to familiarise yourself with your surroundings and identify the hazards associated with MHE, these include; Crush injuries/ Trapping/ Objects falling from height and increased noise levels.



But what are MHE's?

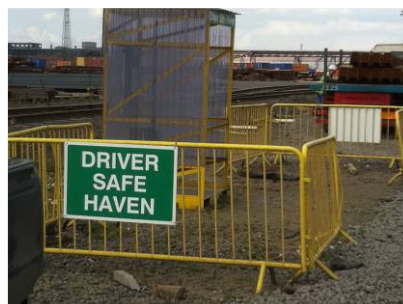
These could be Fork Lift Trucks, Side Loaders, Overhead Cranes even Tipper trucks to name a few. **Don't forget other trucks in trailer parks!**



Look for Warning Signs around YOU



- **S**afe Havens **MUST** be observed.
- **K**eep to designated walkways.
- **I**dentify Hazards.
- **M**ake eye contact with operators if you need to pass and gain permission.
- **PPE** must be worn to be visible. keep it clean.

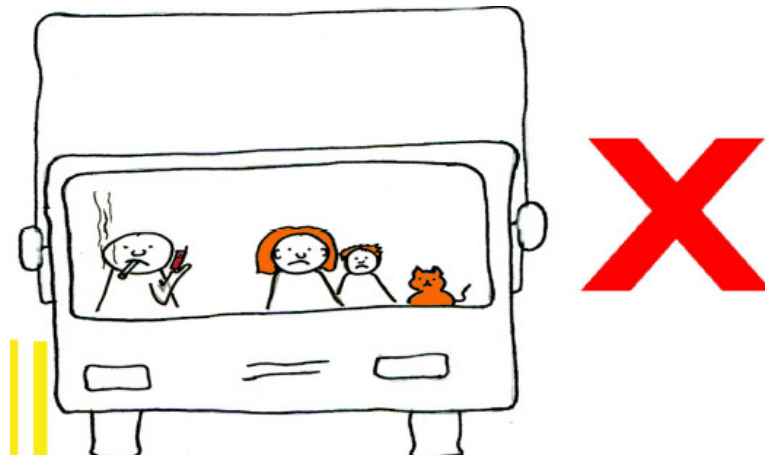
Summer Alert – Children/Unauthorised Passengers on Site & PPE

Children on Site

We do understand that during the summer period some drivers would like to take their family on their truck as passengers. We would like to remind you that it is **forbidden** for children to enter Tata sites for their own safety.

Any Driver arriving at Site with children will be turned away. Adults who are not Co Drivers are also not allowed on site.

Only Co Drivers who have been inducted, carrying full PPE, have their drivers licence and evidence of Tachographs/Digicard for both Drivers will be allowed to accompany the main Driver.
